Upon assuming this senior leadership role in 2020, Professor Shtaif has been active in preparing Tel Aviv University (TAU) for the challenges of the 21st century, a century characterized by the rapid advancement of information technologies and the subsequent societal transformations.

During his tenure as Rector, he has been navigating TAU through the tumultuous times of the COVID-19 pandemic, the contentious judicial reform debates, and the harrowing Iron Swords conflict that ensued after the tragic events of October 7.

In 2002 he joined the Faculty of Engineering at TAU and served as the head of its School of Electrical Engineering in 2017–2020. His fields of study include optical fibers, optical communications, communications theory, and quantum information.
