Dr. Ori Sela is a Senior Lecturer in the Department of East Asian Studies at Tel Aviv University (TAU), of which he served as Chair until 2022. He is also a senior visiting researcher at the Israel-China Policy Center–The Diane and Guilford Glazer Foundation at the Institute for National Security Studies (INSS). Dr. Sela specializes in the history of Early-Modern and Modern China and is specifically interested in the relationship between intellectual history and socio-political history at various periods in China's past.

During the past seven years, Dr. Sela has been leading a project on China in the Middle East in collaboration with the Moshe Dayan Center for Middle Eastern and African Studies, a leading global thinktank, at TAU.

He has written several books and journal articles. His book *China's Philological Turn: Scholars, Textualism, and the Dao in the Eighteenth Century* (Columbia University Press, 2018) was awarded the renowned 2020 Levenson Prize. With Zvi Ben-Dor Benite and Joshua Fogel, he recently edited *Time and Language: New Sinology and Chinese History* (University of Hawaii Press, 2023), a collection of essays about the significance of Sinology for understanding modern China.



He is an alumnus of Tel Aviv University having received both his BA and Master's Degree (*summa cum laude*) from the School of Philosophy, Interdisciplinary Program in Religious Studies, and his PhD in East Asian Studies from Princeton University.
